

How can you help your child?

- ◆ Encourage your child to get themselves dressed and undressed including putting their coat on and fastening it.
- ◆ Play some simple games with your child to support them to develop turn taking and sharing.
- ◆ Encourage your child to count, touch count and recognise numbers within their daily routine at home.
- ◆ Talk about different shapes in the environment.
- ◆ Help your child to write their name (beginning with a capital letter).
- ◆ Share some quality time during the day with your child, to talk with them and ask them questions. This will help to develop their language skills e.g. What have you done at school today?
- ◆ Share the book that they bring home from school, encourage your child to begin to retell the story to you once you have read it a couple of times.
- ◆ Sing nursery rhymes with your child including the ones we are doing this term

Mathematics

We follow Little Big Maths to learn mathematical skills, this includes:-

- Counting different objects
- Counting body parts e.g. 1 head, 2 hands, 10 fingers
- Understand 'too much' and 'not enough'
- Begin to be aware of different shapes in the environment
- Use different mathematical words e.g. tall, short, now, later

Literacy

We are going to be:-

- Making marks on paper to represent our writing or talking about pictures
- Drawing pictures using different writing tools e.g. pens, pencils, felt tips, paint
- Joining in with Letter and Sounds activities
- Sharing stories
- Looking at books independently
- Joining in with songs, rhymes and poems



Understanding the World

We are going to be:-

- Talking about special times and events for ourselves and our families.
- Using ICT to support our learning and developing our skills using computers, Bee-bots and I pads.

Physical Development

We are going to be:-

- Finding a space in the hall and follow instructions to keep ourselves safe during PE.
- Handling different materials and tools with safety and control.
- Moving with confidence, starting and stopping carefully.
- Practising different kinds of movements, e.g. rolling, jumping, skipping.
- Joining in with activities to strengthen the muscles in our fingers, hands and arms which will help us when we do our drawing and writing.
- Learning to put on our PE kits and undo and fasten buttons and zips.
- Developing confidence to take care of own personal needs independently.
